

A REPORT ON GUEST SPEAKER SERIES – JUNE 2025

Held the evening of Wednesday, June 25th at the Collier Theatre, Work Point, 1094 Victoria View Road

Rear-Admiral Robinson discussed HMCS CORNER BROOK





Commander Isabelle discussed Windsor operations between 2014 and 2018, where in addition to normal fleet duties, it deployed for 133 days on Op Projection Euro-Atlantic, the first time a Canadian submarine was operational in the Mediterranean in more than four decades. While on Op Projection, joined NATO allies for Dynamic Manta in the Mediterranean Sea for anti-submarine warfare and anti-surface warfare training. In 2016 it participated in the multi-national joint training engagement

Dynamic Mongoose off the coast of Norway in June, and in NATO's Cutlass Fury in the North Atlantic in September. The year before Windsor deployed for NATO's Joint Warrior and Trident Juncture training engagements along with joint training with Canadian Special Operations Forces personnel. There was no audio-visual recording permitted or available.

Of course, the submarine selected will have enough reserve buoyancy to breakthrough a few feet of ice, and an air-independent capability so they can navigate out from under ice if need be, and to operate without having to snorkel for days. Besides the latest electronic kit, and being well armed, the specification I particularly like is the requirement for a proven, in service, design and no changes to the specifications. Canadianization adds cost, time, and often compromises serviceability instead of improving capabilities.

HMCS OBJIBWA 60TH ANNIVERSARY 23 SEPTEMBER 2025



HMCS *Ojibwa* is an *Oberon-class* <u>submarine</u> that served in the <u>Royal Canadian Navy</u> (RCN) and later the <u>Canadian Forces Maritime Command</u> (MARCOM). Originally intended for service with the <u>British Royal Navy</u> as **HMS** *Onyx*, the submarine was transferred to Canadian ownership before completion and entered RCN service in 1965.

Ojibwa operated primarily with Maritime Forces Atlantic until her decommissioning in 1998. In 2010, Ojibwa was laid up at CFB Halifax awaiting disposal, with the Elgin Military Museum planning to preserve her as a museum vessel. The submarine was towed to Port Burwell, Ontario in 2012, and was opened to the public in 2013. She is now the new focal point of a planned Museum of Naval History to be built alongside the submarine.

HMCS CHICOUTIMI 10TH ANNIVERSARY 03 SEPTEMBER 2025



HMCS Chicoutimi (SSK 879) is a Victoria Class long-range hunter-killer submarine (SSK) of the Royal Canadian Navy. She is the former Royal Navy Upholder-class submarine HMS Upholder. Shortly after being handed over by the UK to Canada, she was involved in a partial flooding incident which resulted in a fire at sea.

The incident sparked a fierce debate over the value of the purchase of this group of second-hand vessels, as well as the handover inspection process. The subsequent investigation "determined the fire was caused by human, technical and operational factors and the board cleared the commanding officer and crew of any blame." The submarine was repaired and entered Canadian service in 2015.





'Good neighbour' noise policy contributed to Esquimalt submarine accident

Noise restrictions at Esquimalt dry dock identified as a contributing factor that compressed a work timeline and led to serious damage to HMCS Corner Brook while undergoing repairs

A voluntary "good neighbour" noise policy at Esquimalt Graving Dock contributed to an accident that led to permanent defects in Canada's most advanced naval submarine.

Canada bought four hunter-killer submarines from the United Kingdom in the late 1990s. Since then, the renamed Victoria-class vessels have been plagued by mechanical and electrical problems. The fleet has spent more time undergoing repairs than in active service.

One of the subs, **HMCS Corner Brook**, struck the seafloor off Nootka Sound, causing extensive damage. An extended overhaul in the federally owned dock kept the submarine out of service until April this year. The work was initially meant to conclude in 2016, but delays dragged on, partially due to a 2019 fire and an accident in 2020.

In 2020, the Department of National Defence found a thumb-sized hole connected to a leak in a main ballast tank — which controls buoyancy — caused when workers inadvertently over pressurized the tank.

<u>Documents in federal court filings</u> said the incident led to significant "damage, deformation and separation" of several of the submarine's bulkheads.

A third-party investigation report commissioned by the contractor Babcock Canada found the 2020 accident was caused by a series of avoidable failures, including a lack of key equipment, a breakdown in communication and pressure to complete a critical test more quickly because of a local noise bylaw.

Ballast tank testing was initially planned to last two days, but, in the end, was compressed into 24 hours.

One of the primary time pressures came from a city noise bylaw, according to the investigation report. Workers were told the bylaw would prevent them from using an external air compressor after 11:30 p.m., the report said.

Workers filled the ballast tanks with 30,000 litres of water to carry out a pressure test. When the test was over, they hooked up an unregulated air compressor to the tank to help force the water out faster in what was later discovered to be an unsanctioned practice.

Within about five minutes, workers found structural damage and water leaking from a hole near the hydroplane.

The Township of Esquimalt previously said its noise bylaws do not apply to the shipyard or the naval base.

Department of National Defence spokeswoman Cheryl Forrest said the permanent defects from the incident do not affect the submarine's strategic capabilities. Asked about the noise bylaw, Forrest said: "All applicable regulatory requirements are being followed."

DND spokesman Brendan Calado-Luke said Babcock Canada and Seaspan's Victoria Shipyards Company (VSL) — the subcontracted labour force — are both required to adhere to Esquimalt Graving Dock's "environmental best management practices."

They include silent hours between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. in order to be a "good neighbour" and reduce any negative impact on surrounding populated areas, said Calado-Luke.

While work continues 24 hours a day, seven days a week, during silent hours, industrial noise is expected to remain below 60 decibels.

Calado-Luke said the facility's requirement to maintain silent hours was "only a single factor" in the 2020 decision to compress work into a 24-hour timeline.

Robert Huebert, executive director of the Centre for Military, Security and Strategic Studies at the University of Calgary, previously said the idea that workers were rushing to finish work on a crucial piece of Canadian military hardware because of local noise concerns was "totally ridiculous." Mark Norman, a former vice-admiral and commander with the Royal Canadian Navy, has said the incident is symptomatic of a country that has become obsessed with "big shiny objects" in the military instead of building up a defence industrial base.

In a statement, DND said the incident was not related to industrial capacity and that its contractors "continuously monitor and improve operational processes to address areas of concern."
